Read: Matthew 1:18-25

v.18a—Meaning of "Messiah"...

- OT awaiting the Chosen One...
- v.18-19—Marriage in Joseph/Mary's day...
 - Lengthy betrothal that's legal but not sexual...
 - Joseph sees the baby bump knowing he's played no part in this transpiring!!!
- v.20—God offers clarity to the confusion...
- Joseph probably didn't fully understand it but was obedient to it...
- **v.21**—Joseph gets baby gender, name, and occupation all up front...
- "saving" comes at great personal cost...
- **v.22-23**—Uncharted territory, not unforeseen territory...prophetic revelation.
- **v.24-25**—No words by Joseph…just silently but obediently playing his role!
 - A picture of the "sweet" life...obedience and faithfulness that moves God's plans forward!
