Intro: Luke's data from OB/GYN, Pediatrics, Genetics (Lk.1-3) to Diet, Exercise, and Sleep.

Read: Luke 6:12-16

- **v.12**—Jesus' all-nighter of prayer...
 - Man doesn't live on *sleep* alone...

v.13-16—From slumber party to the selection of disciples...

Read: Luke 22:39-45

v.39-45—Another incident of skipping sleep for the sake of prayer.

• Again, man doesn't live on *sleep* alone...

Read: Luke 8:22-25 (cf. Mk.4, Mt.8)

v.22-23a—The human need for

sleep...showing the humanity of Jesus...

v.23-24a—Deep sleep!!!


- Storm that scares pro fishermen but doesn't even awaken Jesus!!!
- Storms don't stir Jesus but disciples do! -He hears our pleas more than waves ©
- Cognitive dissonance of disciples... "Master...perishing."

v.24b—Creation responding to Creator...

v.25—In wake of storm, search the soul...



*What do you observe about the early church in Acts?

*The storm in Luke 8 scared seasoned fisherman—what do you think is the significance of fear in the midst of a context so many were already good at?

*Has it ever felt like Jesus was asleep when you were facing a difficult situation? Did Jesus "wake"? What was the outcome?

*We are not promised a life without storms, but Jesus does promise to be with us in the middle of the storm. Why then is it so difficult to trust Him in the middle of life's storms?

*So if we believe that Jesus is on board in our storms, what should we do next time a crisis arises?
